# City of Stonnington Nature Strips policy

In late March members of the Rewilding Stonnington committee were invited to participate in a Zoom briefing session led by members of Council's Climate, Sustainability and City Greening team. The policy is not yet at formal draft stage but proposals so far look promising; the overall aim being to encourage nature strip revegetation projects including with clear guidelines and an online application and approvals process. The guidelines will also encourage planting with indigenous and endemic species. As Prahran-South Yarra residents may be aware, the South Yarra Siding Reserve parklands will be reopening mid-2023, following handback from the Metro Tunnel Project. Council has called for feedback on proposals for the park, including that it become a dog-on-lead area.
