City of Stonnington Nature Strips policy

Important update: the new policy is heading to Council for approval! Possibly in early July.

IF the features indicated in the briefing we received are retained, i.e. a fundamental shift towards encouraging resident engagement to preserve and enhance green space, promote indigenous/native species and improve biodiversity including:

- on line in principle approval process

- clear statement of requirements and prohibitions
- protection for 'legacy' plantings
- maximum planting height of 90cm

- 30cm offset from kerbs and around tree trunks, with permission to mulch/plant around established trees

This will be an enormous step forward!!

PLEASE write to the Mayor and your Ward Councillors to indicate your support, emphasising the urgent need for a simplified process to encourage community engagement, nature strips as green space and improved biodiversity in Stonnington! <u>Mayor and Councillors</u> Check the Nature Strips section on our website for hints ... <u>RS Nature Strips</u>
